1. Overview

The National Institute of Development Administration (NIDA) was established on April 1, 1966. It is an institution of higher education in Thailand that has produced personnel to meet the country's developmental needs. It offers graduate programs at the master's and doctoral levels, promotes the conducting of high-quality research and continuously provides academic services to the public with dedication and passion. At present, it offers studies in fields related to development administration, namely Public Administration, Business Administration, Development Economics, Applied Statistics, Social Development, Environmental Management, Language and Communication, Human Resource Development, Law, Integrated Tourism Management, Communication Arts and Management Innovation, and Business Management.

Over the years, NIDA has annually organized three major conferences, consisting of the National Conference (held on the Institute's anniversaries), the International Conference on Advancement of Development Administration - Social Sciences and Interdisciplinary Studies (NIDA ICADA-SSIS) and the NIDA International Conference for Case Studies on Development Administration (NIDA-ICCS). These conferences' shared objectives are to disseminate works of academics both in and outside NIDA, provide forums for sharing knowledge and exploring ideas, and present research that benefits the country's development.


This year, NIDA deems it appropriate to organize, for the first time, the NIC-NIDA Conference which combines the national and international academic conference with the case studies forum. The conference is on “SDGs and BCG Model” and will be conducted via Zoom on August 18 -19, 2022. Its main activities include keynote and plenary lectures, panel and roundtable discussions and academic presentations related to sustainable development in line with the United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) and Bio-Circular-Green Economy (BCG). The keynote lectures and presentations will be delivered by academics from the 11 disciplines as stated above.

3. Overview of Conference Theme

Bio- Circular- Green Economic Model or BCG has been introduced by the research community and promoted by the Thai government as a new economic model for inclusive and sustainable growth. The BCG model capitalizes on the country's strengths in biological diversity and cultural richness and employs technology and innovation to transform Thailand to a value-based and innovation-driven economy. The model also conforms to the UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and is also intended to align with the Sufficiency Economy Philosophy (SEP) which is the key principle of Thailand's social and economic development. The Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), also known as the Global Goals, are a universal call to action to end poverty, protect the planet and ensure that all people enjoy peace and prosperity. The 17 SDGs are a part of transforming our world: the 2030 Agenda, which was adopted by 193 Member States at the historic UN General Assembly Summit in September 2015 and came into effect on January 1, 2016. The SDGs have been developed through an unprecedented consultative process that brought national governments and millions of citizens from across the globe together to negotiate and adopt the ambitious agenda.



4. Conference Objectives

- (1) Be a platform that brings together researchers, academics, professionals, scholars and university students, national or international, to exchange their views and share their insights on the SDGs and BCG Models.
- (2) Promote the production and dissemination of research works in various fields relating to development administration.
- (3) Provide a public stage where academic, professional and student participants can present their research at the international level.
- (4) Promote the growth of research and development, and teaching and policy suggestions in the economic, social and governance realms.
- (5) Broaden social networks among academics from both local and international institutions, which could lead to initiation of new or further cooperation among them as well as support from agencies in both private and public sectors.

Only the authors of qualified works will be invited to give a presentation at the conference and published in the NIDA Development Journal and NIDA Case Research Journal or if (1) the author(s) submit his/her both abstract(s) and full paper(s) by the due dates, (2) their works are peer reviewed and qualified by the selected reviewers, and (3) the author(s) give his/her/their presentations at the conference.

Also, a certificate will be presented to the author(s) whose his/her/their article(s) has been peer-reviewed and awarded as a top paper/top case. Those papers will be published in the NIDA Development Journal and NIDA Case Research Journal.

10.1 Full Paper/ Case Study Submission:

- Full paper (including case studies) must be written according to the format given in the "The paper template" section.
- Full paper (including case studies) submission must be made via <http://conference.nida.ac.th/> and within the given due dates and as the attached file(s) in the MS Word format only.
- The maximum length of both an abstract is 150 - 250 words, that of a full paper no longer than 25 pages (excluding tables, appendices, and references) and keywords of 3-5 words.

10.2 Ph.D. Consortium:

- Students who are midway through their Ph.D.
- In the process of research proposal (Thesis)
- The presenters must submit their research papers to their advisors for endorsement and approval to be eligible to present in the conference.
- The presenters will be awarded a certificate by the organizer without any obligation to publish their papers.

All Full paper (including case studies) must be typed in English and in the APA format only (<http://www.apa.org/>). The language use must be grammatically correct. Full papers must be submitted by the given due dates. Full papers with poorly written English will not be considered.
